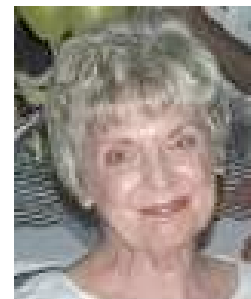

The Inn has been in continuous operation since 1885 and although it has had several owners, in the fall of '85 Michael and Marie Halliday became the new owners. With an appreciation for its historical value, they have managed to restore the inn to its original charm and beauty. The hotel has no televisions or telephones in the guest rooms in order to keep with the era in which it was built. A dinner theatre, out-door swimming pool, tennis court, and horseshoes are just a few of the amenities. There are also beautiful gardens and a lovely large porch with rocking chairs, although it was too cool to rock on this particular day.

**T**he weather was a lot warmer as we left the Inn and we were all able to have our roofs down. We zoomed-zoomed through Titusville, Emlenton, and Foxburg and followed the Allegheny River a large part of the way. Our trip ended in West Kittanning and of course we stopped for ice

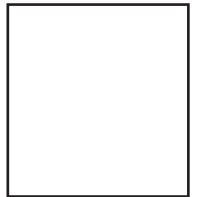
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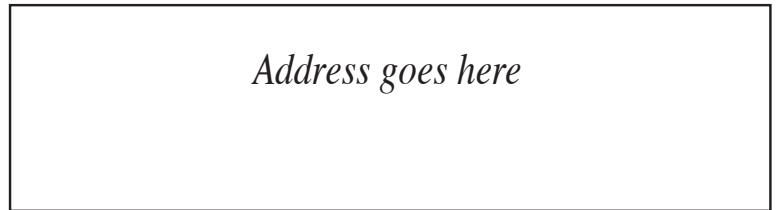
