

Not only does this give me a deep appreciation for my auto mechanic, it also gives me hands on experience to the marvel of engineering that is the Mazda Miata. Every component has been fitted into a compact space to be functional, reliable, and fun.

This past winter I was trying to access the header but first I had to get the heat shield removed. Every bolt was accessible, but there wasn't any wasted space. Sometimes I needed to stop and think about what I was doing and how the engineers expected me to perform the task at hand. Invariably there was an optimal way to perform each task and so long as I found the right way (thank you YouTube), it could be done without special tools. I was not looking forward to removing some 20+ clips holding them in. Then I looked more closely, and there was a small access panel held by one clip at the back of the wheel well right where I needed it to be. I popped the clip and that was all the access I needed. Not only did they build a car that was fun to drive, efficiently utilize the space available, but they also anticipated how those parts could be accessed and maintained.
